And the trend is continuing. In 2005, the number of obese people in the United States was estimated to be 33 percent of the population. The increase in obesity is not limited to the United States. In many other countries, the number of obese people is also increasing. In fact, the World Health Organization estimates that by 2015, the number of obese people in the world will be 1 billion.





In the 20 years since NAFTA was signed by the governments of the United States, Canada and Mexico, trade among the three nations has flourished. Imports from Canada and Mexico to the U.S. have increased 244%, while exports to those countries from the U.S. has increased 218%.
